FIRST AID - NOTES TO PHYSICIAN:

Skin: Gently and thoroughly wash the contaminated skin with running water and non-abrasive soap. Be particularly careful to clean folds, crevices, creases and groin.

Ingestion: Seek medical attention. Do not induce vomiting unless directed by a physician. Give large amounts of water or milk.

Inhalation: Move exposed person to fresh air. In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention.

Note to Physician: Possible mucosal damage may contraindicate use of gastric lavage.
